Mostafa Saadeq Al-Rafei was an Egyptian writer of Syrian origins. He was born in the village of Bahteem in January 1880. When he was a teenager he had typhoid fever which made him gradually loose his hearing. At the age of thirty, he became completely deaf. Despite this, Al-Rafei became one of the most famous Arab poets of the early twentieth century.

Al-Rafei used his poetry to express his deep feelings and great thoughts. He composed the words of the Egyptian national anthem adopted between 1923 and 1936. The words of the Tunisian national anthem are largely the work of Al-Rafe'ie.

Al-Rafe'ie was called the genius of literature. He wrote over 25 books based on Quran and Arabic language sciences. The most famous books are the 'History of Arabic Literature' ' The Miracle of Quran' and 'Under the Banner of Quran'. 'Inspiration of pen' is also one of his most famous books. It comes in three parts including articles and stories he wrote in the period from 1934 to 1937. The depth he added to his ideas gave them a strong effect.

Mustafa Saadeq Al Rafe'ie died in 1937 at the age of 57. He left a rich library of knowledge for every reader around the world.
