





Tawfiq al Hakim was one of the best Arab play-writers of the Y.th century. He was born in NAAA in Alexandria to an Egyptian father and a Turkish mother. He started his primary school in Alexandria. Then he moved to Cairo with his uncles to continue his studies at Mohammed Ali Secondary school. After studying in Cairo, Tawfiq moved to Paris where he graduated in law. After three years in Paris, he returned to Egypt in NAYA. He worked as a manager of the Egyptian National Library. He got married and had two children; a son and a daughter. His wife died in NAYA. His son died in NAYA in a car accident.

Tawfiq wrote many plays, novels and poems. His first play was" the fate of cockroach" He also played an important role in the development of Arabic drama. He died in 1944.
