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ARRIVING AT FINAL SCORES

VCB/ GRM/ RDG: In these three sections, all student responses are of the objectively-marked, right-orwrong type. So there should never be any discrepancies in the marks awarded.

There are two different procedures for ensuring that no such discrepancies occur:

- No action required: With (machine-marked) 'Multiple Choice', 'Matching' or 'True/False' items —
 i.e. in VCB 1, VCB 2, GRM 1, GRM 2, RDG 1, RDG 2, RDG 3, RDG 4 discrepancies are
 automatically excluded by the ePen marking system.
- 2) Action required: With 'short answer' items, where the student has to write something down i.e. in VCB 3, GRM 3 there may be (accidental) discrepancies in the scores awarded by the two markers. The Supervisor/Adjudicator should be on the lookout for any such discrepancies, and if they occur, should read the students' response and award the correct mark.

WRITING: In this section, student responses are independently marked by two markers using their judgement (based on the wording of the Rating Scale provided). As a result, differences may sometimes occur between the two scores awarded.

In such cases, there are two possible procedures:

- Acceptable differences: If as in most cases the difference between the two scores is small, i.e. just one level, the Supervisor/Adjudicator is not required to read the student's response. The system will automatically produce the mathematical average of the two scores [Note: However, if, for some reason, this has not happened, the Supervisor/Adjudicator should do the relevant calculation (See below*)].
- Unacceptable differences: However, if the difference between the two scores is substantial, i.e. more than one level, the Supervisor/Adjudicator must read the student's response and, after due consideration, decide on an appropriate mark.

IMPORTANT NOTE: As in previous years, *individual* markers should *only* award the marks specified in the relevant Rating Scale* (as in 'pair of scores' above). 'Half-marks' or 'in-between marks' (as in 'final score' above) can *only* be awarded when two (differing) individual marks are combined by the Supervisor/ Adjudicator.

[* <u>Note</u>: This means that, even though the computer screen shows <u>all</u> the possible <u>final</u> scores, **individual** markers should **only** use those scores which are mentioned in the scale.]
