٥	 Discusses the topic in a lively, interesting way, making effective use of supportingarguments. The points made by the writer are logically organised and very clear. Makes use of a fair range of structures and vocabulary, with a good level of accuracy.
٤	 Discusses the topic reasonably well, but use of supporting arguments is not fully effective. The points made by the writer are reasonably well organized and mostly clear. Use of grammar and vocabulary is reasonably correct, though rather limited in range.

Listening Y

Mark Twain was an American writer. He was born in 'Aro in the USA. He had i brothers and sisters. When he was i years old, his family moved to a village near the river. A few years later, Mark's father died so he had to find a job. In 'Aro', he worked as a riverboat pilot on the Mississippi River. His salary from this job was very good at that time. Then, because of the war in the USA in 'Aro' between people of the North and those of the South, traffic along the river stopped and so Mark lost his job. In search of a new job, Mark travelled west in July of 'Aro', with his brother, Orion. They arrived in a new city where Mark found a job in a newspaper. It was a good chance for him to start writing and make people enjoy reading. In 'Aro', Mark Twain married a girl called Olivia and her father's name was Langdon. Their first child was also called Langdon. This name was the same as the father of Mark Twain's wife. We learnt about the life of Mark Twain. It is right that he died in 'aro', but his books remind us of him. He wrote famous stories such as "Adventures of Tom Sawyer" in 'Aro' and "Life on the Mississippi" in 'Aro'.
