Film Tourism

Have you ever watched a movie and thought, 'I want to go there'? Movies can actually inspire people to visit places they had never thought of going to before. Travelling to destinations that are connected with the world of film is known as 'film tourism'. Films have long had the means of making even the most ordinary of places look extraordinary and meaningful. This is why, in 2012, Tourism Competitive Intelligence Research (TCIR) found that 40 million international tourists chose their holiday destination because they had seen a film shot in that particular location. In one extreme case, people started visiting the deep-blue door of a house in London after it had been featured in a famous movie. Eventually, this door had to be painted a different colour because it was attracting too many crowds.

Nowadays, countries across the world are working hard to develop film tourism by increasing the number of film related facilities and attractions available to tourists. These facilities include film tours, museums, exhibitions and film festivals.

One example of a country promoting film tourism is New Zealand. With its diverse natural landscapes, it is a top location for making films. A number of top-rated movies have been filmed in locations there. Fans of a famous book that was made into a popular movie travel to New Zealand from all over the world. They call themselves Tolkien Tourists because the author of the book was called Tolkien. These tourists can experience some of the amazing locations used in the film, including beautiful lakes and snow-covered mountains. They can even visit a village that was created for the movie and that remains exactly as it was in the film.

Bollywood, in India, is the biggest film-producing centre in the world. Bollywood movies have resulted in millions of Bollywood fans from many different countries visiting Mumbai. Due to the large number of European film tourists visiting India each year, in 2012, a famous British airline launched a new daily flight from London to Mumbai to support the growth of film tourism. India also has a number of 'Film Cities'. Film cities are huge studios where Bollywood movies are filmed. These studios attract millions of tourists every year. Visitors can take organised tours of film cities in order to enjoy the Bollywood experience in person.

Turkey is another country that has everything a film director could want. The Cappadocia region, where many Hollywood and European films have been shot, is like an open-air film studio. It has been the location of many movies over the last 15 years. One reason for its popularity among film producers is its exceptional geographic characteristics such as underground cities, beautiful valleys and houses carved into rocks.

Film locations around the world are attracting large numbers of visitors every year. However, film tourism is still an underdeveloped industry. There are no limitations to what the future might hold for this growing type of tourism.
















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
