The children loved it! In fact, as soon as they finished reading their books, they suggested going to the bookshop and buying some more! So now there is peace and quiet togetherness in the house — which is exactly what we wanted!

So it seems from this example that teenagers cannot always make their own decisions about how to spend their time. They need some direction from their parents. In other words, it is the parents who should shape the future of their children.
