Taha Hussein was one of the most famous writers in Egypt. He was born in Al-Minya on November 15th , 1889. He had seven brothers and five sisters. His family was poor. When he was three years old, he had an eye disease. Then he became blind when he was six. However, by the age of thirteen Taha Hussein memorized the Holly Quran. He went to Al-kuttab. He was admitted to El Azhar University where he studied Arabic literature. Then he travelled to France in 1914 to study his PHD. Taha Hussein read books about Islam which gave him many ideas for his writing. He wrote many stories and essays. His famous book was El-Ayyam (The days). Taha Hussein got married to Suzanne and they had two children, a daughter and a son. Taha Hussein became the minister of Education in 1950. He died on October 28th in 1973 in Cairo.




